

ORDINANCE NO. 10- 11 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING BURGESS & NIPLE, INC. TO PERFORM ADDITIONAL ENGINEERING WORK RELATED TO THE ONGOING IMPROVEMENTS AT THE CITY OF OBERLIN RAW WATER PUMP STATION AND AT THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute the attached agreement with Burgess & Niple, Inc. for additional engineering work related to the ongoing improvements at the City of Oberlin Raw Water Pump Station and at the Water Treatment Plant in an amount not to exceed \$23,300.00.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.



**SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 5
BETWEEN
CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO
AND
BURGESS & NIPLE, INC.
FOR ENGINEERING AND ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES**

This Supplemental AGREEMENT shall be attached to and become a part of the Master AGREEMENT dated July 1, 2002.

SECTION III – SCOPE OF SERVICES

C. DESIGN IMPROVEMENTS

C-4 Services During Construction

The construction of improvements at the Water Treatment Plant is currently ongoing and, per a conversation with the General Contractor, and Water Treatment Plant staff, substantial completion should be realized by mid February, and completion by the end of March.

Some of B&N's construction services will require additional time and expense due to this 7 month extension. The following services will require additional time:

1. Review and recommend payment or nonpayment of requests for progress payment by the Contractor.
2. Prepare additional detailed meeting minutes.
3. Schedule and conduct meetings at the site, as necessary to review the work.
4. Respond to requests for information regarding the application of the Contract Documents.
5. Meetings with the OWNER as required. Provide additional project management.

Nothing in this AGREEMENT, with respect to furnishing of Construction Administration, Services shall be construed to make B&N responsible for, nor to have control of, construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the work, nor to make B&N responsible for the contractor's failure to carry out the work in accordance with the Contract Documents, nor to confer responsibility upon B&N for any acts or omissions of the Contractor, subcontractors, or others performing or inspecting the work.


SECTION IV – FEE FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

B&N will provide these services on the basis of the attached hourly fee schedule, plus reimbursable expenses for a not-to-exceed fee of \$23,300, unless approved in writing by the OWNER. This will increase the Services During Construction fee from \$187,650 as shown in Supplemental Agreement No. 4 to \$210,950.


