









Question 7: How would you rate the condition of the City's streets?










Question 10: How aware are you of a community choice donation program for net Renewable Energy Credit (REC) proceeds?














Question 17: How important are the City of Oberlin's parks and open spaces to you?




















Question 25: How important are the City of Oberlin's Fire services to you?















Question 33: Into what age bracket do you fall?





Top Line Common Themes

- Residents and business owners refer to the City of Oberlin as a small, friendly, walkable town
- The fact that the city is viewed as diverse and a college town were viewed as positive and negative
- The top ranked services in the city are municipal services (water, sewer, electric), Police and Fire
- When ranked individually, sustainability/environmental issues ranked high but when compared to other services, it comes down in rank





Top Line Common Themes (cont.)

- Streets are very important to residents, there is a perception they are in poor condition
- Recreation is ranked lowest and there is a perception there is not a lot of communication about programs
- From the business interviews/focus groups, the city is perceived as not easy to work with regarding permits, etc.
- From the business interviews/focus groups, the city is perceived as responsive to needs of businesses
- The top methods to communicate to residents is through email, the local newspaper and the website




































Q39 Are you currently a student or recent graduate at Oberlin College?







Q40 How many years have you lived in the City of Oberlin? – 1 non resident; 1 no answer





- What were the main reasons you moved your business to Oberlin? It was due to convenience. The original owner used to sell books between New York and Chicago and used to stay at the original Oberlin Inn. He finally said "why am I going back and forth" and settled in Oberlin.
- What are the main reasons you continue to do business in Oberlin?
 It would be hard to move and relocate. It is a good location easy access to highways, airport, etc. We have no plans of moving but we will be hiring more regional people.
- What are some things the City of Oberlin is doing well? In the past few years, the City is friendlier with the businesses. The town people have a negative attitude toward the industrial businesses, they don't understand we pay a lot in income and property tax. The group in the City right now is more receptive. The new City manager seems to have the City at the forefront of his mind and is more upbeat.
- What are some things The City of Oberlin could be doing better?

 There are little things they could do for example, a great thing for us to advertise we are hiring is to hang banners, which the City says we cannot do. We couldn't hang a sign on the side of our building that we were one of the top companies. We had to get a permit for our company picnic and had to jump through hoops. We just want to reward our employees. The permit process is not smooth.

We had a storm sewer issue – it was built on the wrong side, kept going back and forth with the city. The city blamed everyone else but they hired all the contractors.

Things are much better now. There are regular communication meetings happening and they are going well. The City manager is more engaged.

How can the City help you be more successful?
We are a business that doesn't sell in the City. Everything is going well as long as they communicate to us. We need to know things such as shut downs, streets, etc. They seem to be utilizing the emergency alert systems more, which is a feather in their cap.



- Do you anticipate any major changes with your business in the next one year? Five years?
 - Yes, and I have met with the City. We are rebranding ourselves. This will lead to remodeling and redesigning of our interior. This will be a 1-3 year process and we will be hiring more people. Not leaving our location.
- In your perception, is the City easy to work with? Do the City employees respond to your needs and requests quickly?
 Yes. It will be interesting to see as our renovation takes place. I am not assuming any issues will come up.
- What advice can you leave us to pass along to the administration?
