RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Items Accepted in Curbside Recycling:

• Paper - Newspaper, Envelopes, Mail, Phone Books, Magazines

• Plastic #1 & #2 - Water/Soda Bottles, Milk Jugs, Shampoo Bottles, Detergent Containers

Cardboard - Flattened Boxes, Food Boxes with Liners Removed, File Folders, Poster Board

Metal - Aluminum Cans, Food Cans

Recyclables should be **EMPTY, CLEAN & DRY** before placing in your recycling cart. Place recyclables **LOOSE & UNBAGGED** in your cart. **NO SORTING REQUIRED!**

If you have subscribed to the Recycling Program and a black & white recycling sticker has NOT been placed on your cart, please email Recycling@CityofOberlin.com or call 440-775-7218.
