HAPPENINGS

- Following input from residents, the design for the Morgan St. Reservoir area is being finalized.
- With help from an Urban Forestry Grant and Oberlin College's Green Edge Fund, 86 trees have been planted throughout the community, representing 23 different tree species. 47 "large" trees, 29 "medium" trees, and 10 "small' trees were planted.
- The city's Water Treatment Plant is getting a new roof!
- RECs were sold and new Green-E RECs were purchased to make OMLPS 2020 power supply 100% carbon neutral. This transaction put funds in OMLPS's Sustainable Reserve Program.
- We are happy to welcome Jason Keltner as our new Buildings and Grounds Superintendent.
